

## **Minutes from Client Meeting**

Present: Bruce Connolly, Fawaz Alotaibi, Hilary Sizemore, Devin Kelley, Client, Four POA Residents

- Meeting began at 9:20am on September 18, 2013 at the project site
  - The concerns and comments of the POA residents were first addressed and follow below
    - The existing bridge must be protected
      - Stop the erosion of the crossing's foundation
    - Must have a design ready in case existing bridge is washed out
    - Many of the residents' are only up for the weekend and therefore are not willing to spend much on the new bridge
    - No bedrock at the site
    - The residents are usually stuck five days out of the year
    - Stuck for four days at rare times
    - There are four 48" diameter culverts
    - 110 cubic yards of concrete was added to fill voids caused by erosion and used to create/ extend apron/ wing walls/ retaining walls
    - 30 ton limit on bridge
    - Forest service granted easement 50' wide
    - Residents would like a design that allowed two way traffic
    - Residents would like to have plans for a pedestrian bridge
    - Indicated desire for box culvert design
      - Help with the reduction of blockage due to debris flow
  - Ms. Dzierson has mentioned that water often pools as high as the 89-A elevation
  - The association is willing to put down \$85,000 for maintenance for five to eight years
  - The association will pay \$250,000 to \$300,000 for a new bridge
    - The plans for this bridge will be provided
  - The most important aspect is for the bridge to be safe
  - Devin asked if aesthetics are important
    - It is not important to the client
  - Meeting ended at 10:20am
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- Following the end of the meeting, dimensions of the crossing were taken and recorded
