Subject: Archeological Investigation Permit

An Archeological Investigation Permit for the Shultz Creek Restoration Project (SCRCP) is required due to the site being located on the Museum of Northern Arizona (MNA) property. The property is located on a natural flood plain, where the stream will be rerouted by excavation to align with the culvert under Highway 180. The company specified on the permit will be the American Conservation Experience (ACE) because they will be responsible for excavating the soil. Important information to complete the permit application is listed below:

- Nature of archeological work proposed (pg. 7 of Appendix B)
- Description of project site, including GPS coordinates, UTM coordinates, township, range and section subdivision or metes and bounds
- Engineered drawings of proposed work area where permit is needed
- Detailed description of project purpose explaining the proposed work

As explained in the “Bureau of Land Management Arizona: Instructions for Obtaining a Permit for Archeological Investigations” document, as seen in Appendix B, the processing rate for an application with all the necessary information is 45 days. However, if Native Americans are concerned, there may be a delay up to 70 days. Once the application is completely filled out, it should be sent to the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), their Phoenix address is provided below.
